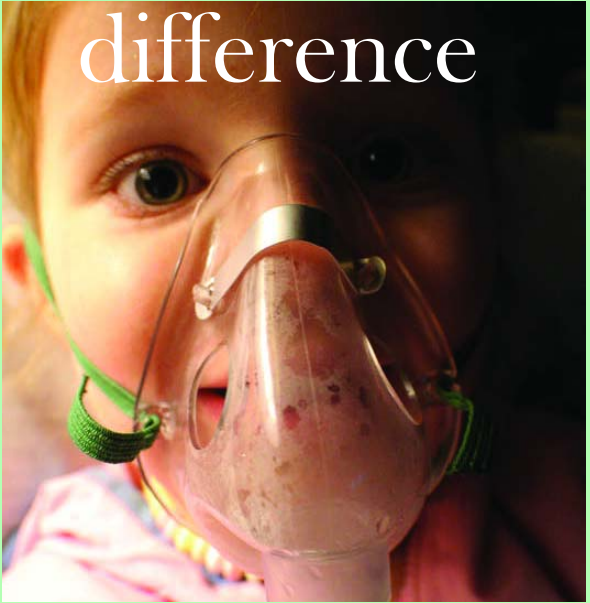

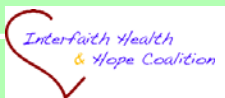

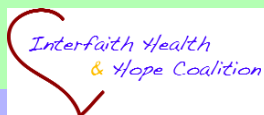


Asthma can kill...

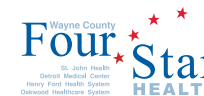
